WILDLIFE HAZARD MANAGEMENT PROGRAM for COLORADO AIRPORTS January – December 2013

Cooperative Service Agreement between USDA-APHIS-Wildlife Services and CDOT-Division of Aeronautics

- *Assisted 17 Colorado airports with wildlife hazard management efforts through technical or direct control assistance*
- *Conducted initial site visits to 3 airports*
- *Provided FAA mandated wildlife hazard mitigation training to 113 airport personnel representing 7 airports*
- *Supervised existing Wildlife Hazard Assessments being conducted under separate cooperative service agreements*
- *Administered the start of Wildlife Hazard Assessments under separate agreements*
- *Reviewed and updated 7 FAA-approved Wildlife Hazard Management Plans*
- *Obtained required federal and state wildlife control permits for multiple airports*
- *Conducted Burrowing owl surveys prior to construction activities*
- *Treated prairie dog colonies with aluminum and zinc phosphide on multiple airports*
- *Trapped and relocated hawks from airports that posed a threat to aviation safety*
- *Harassed various species of wildlife from safety areas*
- *Assisted multiple airports with proper bird strike reporting procedures*
- *Provided habitat management recommendations including review of construction projects*
- *Attended National Bird Strike Conference to receive re-certification credits for FAA Qualified Airport Wildlife Biologist*
- *Presented updates on the Wildlife Hazard Management Program in Colorado during CAO Spring Conference*
